I apologise for the silence but I am trying to source a document that shows that a registered letter was sent to the address. As soon as I have it I will forward it to you along with the health document from Western Cape Government which formed part of the decision making documents.

The legal position is unfortunately that the obligation on the applicant/Council is only to send the notification by registered mail. The Post Office must show that a notification was sent to the address and that the letter was either collected or not collected. I am not aware if the City does has that information.

I assume you are considering taking this to the High court to have the decision reversed. As this is a costly business you may want the other neighbours to contribute.

The family living behind us (living right opposite the mast) say they have never received registered mails.
Who can we request that list from? And can we petition for it to be taken down?
Also a copy of the health report from the tribunal would be great to have as well.

Hello Brian,
I am writing this on behalf of my father and mother Lionel and Lorraine Johannes, who have contacted you before via Facebook Messenger.
It was in response to the newly erected cell tower or receiver a street away from where we live in Silveroak Avenue. About 20 to 30m away.
It was put up on the church grounds but is higher than our double storey and literally is in our view from our main bedroom.
What upsets us and concerns us is that it was erected without consent from the people in the area The neighbours etc. We have spoken to some of the neighbours ourselves and none of them are happy either and none have given consent for this structure.
It's literally next to houses and not in within acceptable range for safety/concerns: it has been noted that these erect receivers/towers (on carte blanche and other media) can contribute to health issues like headaches, radiation that can cause cancers and tumors, memory loss, cardiovascular stress, low sperms count and birth defects.
We need to know what can be done to get rid of it.
